



Dell t3500 power supply problems

© 1996-2014, Amazon.com, Inc. or its affiliates Hello, I have a PB12 problem with my Dell T3500. Shows 1 + 2 lights . This generally means a motherboard issue . The oddity here is that this problem arose some time ago and then disappeared , a few weeks ago the front two fans started running at high speed constantly up until yesterday when i decided to shut down instead of sleep/hibernate . I have cleared BIOS and reseated the graphics card / memory (also tried 3 ram sticks / 6 ram and switched them) . During the startup attempt all fans run , front 2 , rear 2 and Graphics card / memory (also tried 3 ram sticks / 6 ram and switched them) . , why would it work up until now ? This is the second M/B (the first was replaced by the vendor - well actually swapped the whole computer) that I have had this problem as a replacement is not available locally , and the shipping expensive . Last edited: May 26, 2018 I just repaired a Dell Precision T3500 a week ago. Same symptoms and it ended up being a bad motherboard. I ordered a good tested one off Ebay and replaced it. Why would I previously have a PB12 issue (tried many times and resigned to a junk throw away computer), then suddenly repaired itself and continued for many weeks ? Can anyone explain what has actually classe is a marvel and made to a high standard, the power supply suitable for long use, But I am more that a little miffed at not one, but two boards failing for exactly the same reason within a relatively short time. It's possible (not for sure) you may have a faulty PSU which is the cause of your problems. I would at least try switching in a different PSU to see if that helps before you assign the motherboard to the garbage bin. EUREKA !! I have recovered from this PB12 error ! I am now sending this post from the same computer that everyone condemned as broken . Sorry for this blatant act of crowing but I have not heard from anyone who has done this . Am I alone in this ? daveybrat I hope you did not throw out your old (considered Useless) motherboard? I must have tried hundreds of times to get this thing working, press the power button and 1 + 2 lights flash and the power shuts off - Then I see something, and figure out the back-door. EUREKA !! I have recovered from this PB12 error ! I am now sending this post from the same computer that everyone condemned as broken. 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Now , AT WILL , I can get the computer to flash not the 1 + 2 front panel lights, but the 3 + 4, which is the normal starting sequence. The problem is that it then shuts down. Any insights would be appeciated to get a T3500 working after a PB12 error? XavierMace All information available to me online suggests that a PB12 is terminal (as in cannot use) I have no info on anyone who has gotten further than 1 + 2, but I eagerly await further comments . I am interested in finding out more information, if others have managed the same and what exactly is the component at fault. Recoverable - Able to be rectified; correctable; fixable. Dry/loose solder joints that occasionally make contact, but often don't. That's my guess. Back, again. Now after I get it working again (Just done it for the 4th time) I can put it into sleep mode and it will re-start, into shutdown and it will re-start (but not the last time which was an overnight shutdown). After a temporary system failure would not start. The power light itself is green fixed. The power button on the front panel is completely released. I read a lot of messages and other information about a similar problem. Therefore, I did following: 1. unplug everything, press the power button / stop for 1 minute and retries. without success 2. replace the CMOS battery. without success 3A jumps the Green and black 20 supply connection wire pins to motherboard.
